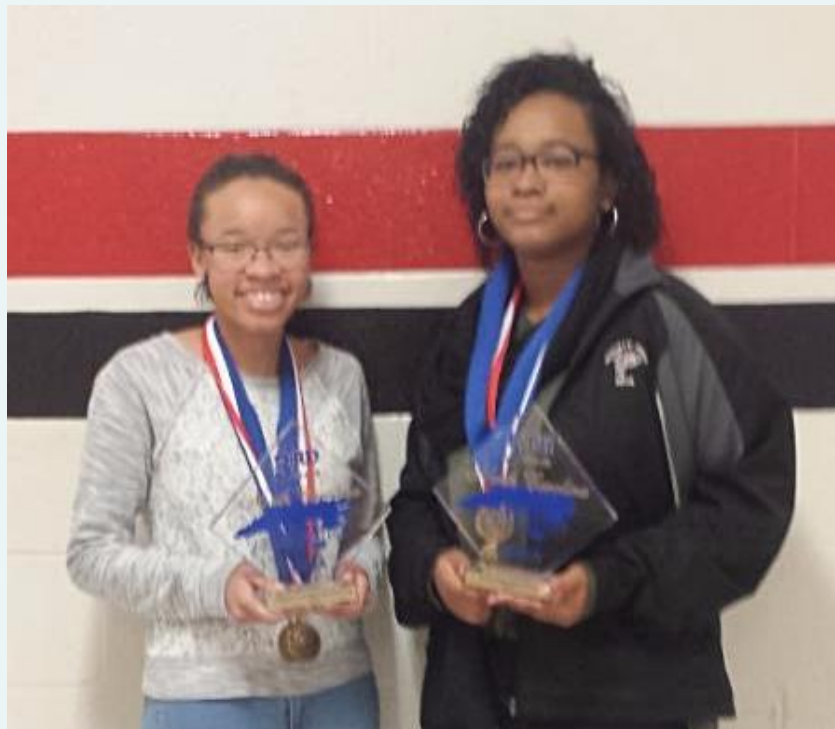

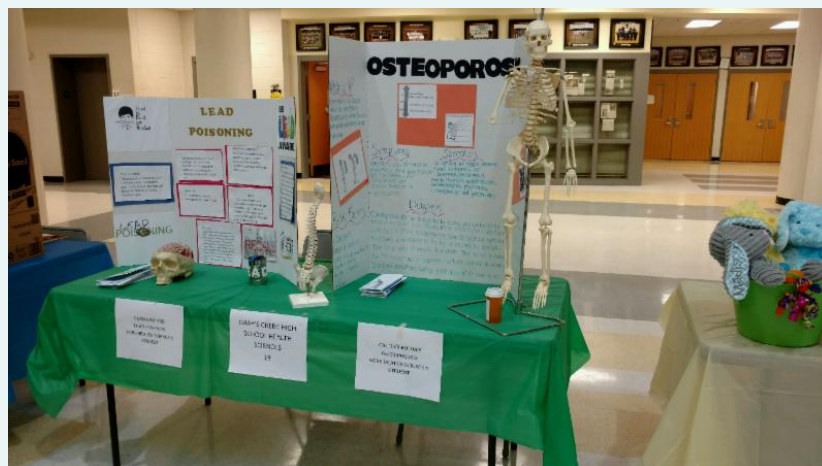

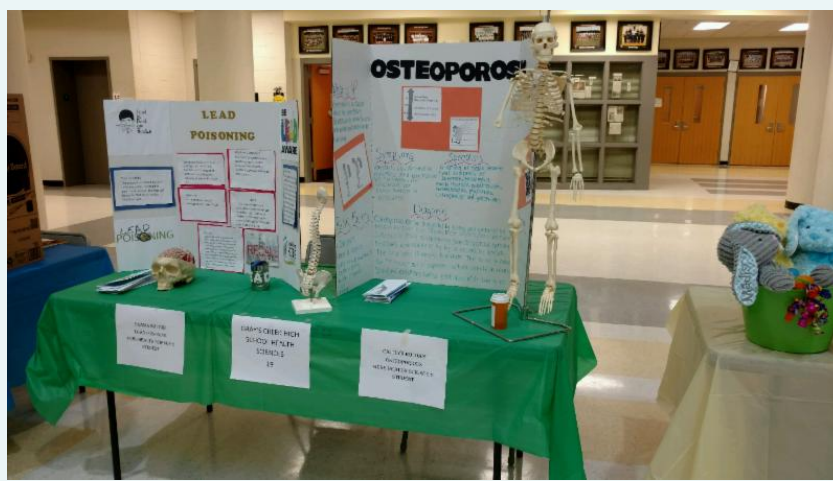
Gray's Creek District Family Night
