SVHS Public Safety and Security Academy Students Tour the Center for Defense and Homeland Security

The Public Safety and Security Academy students at South View High School took a field trip to the Center for Defense and Homeland Security (CDHS) located on the campus of Fayetteville State University on February 16, 2018. The students were greeted by the staff and given an overview of the center by Mr. John Bellamy, Interim Executive Director. The students watched a video on "Mobile Device Security" and "Password Security". Mr. Bellamy stated their center seeks to develop innovative solutions and prepare the next generation of leaders within the STEM, Cybersecurity, national security, and emergency management disciplines for the world of work. The Program Manager for Federal Internships, Mr. Mose Harris, discussed with the students the Dos and Don'ts of "Social Media-Road to Success". The students had the opportunity to share their experiences in using social media websites and ask questions on how to protect themselves from hackers. Mr. Harris cautioned the students on what information they put out on social media sites because of future employment, acceptance into colleges and universities, and people who are looking to commit a crime against them. The students were given a tour of FSU Student Center and treated to lunch in the college cafeteria. Later, the students travelled to the Cybers ecurity Lab located off Ramsey Street. They were given an overview of the Cybersecurity Lab, careers available, and employment opportunities by Mr. Steve Hunter, President. The students were allowed to participate in interactive learning activities with Mr. Jeff Epps, Master instructor at the lab before boarding the bus back to school.
